They just couldn't seem to keep their eyes open. Every day, several villagers just fell asleep in broad daylight and remained asleep for at least a couple of hours. Some of them had reported only waking up after a couple of days. There was no apparent reason for these "sleep incidents", and more than 100 residents had inexplicably fallen asleep when they weren't tired over the course of a few years.

In September 2014, several children who were attending school on the first day of the new academic year also fell asleep for no reason. Medical experts were unable to come up with a verified explanation, much less a "cure" or form of prevention. Naturally, some of those who suffered from this "condition" were terrified that they might die in their sleep.

Some of the "sleepers" had reported strange feelings of memory loss, vertigo and extreme nausea after waking from their sleep. Other symptoms even included hallucinations. In addition to all this, doctors have found that some of the people suffering from this ailment have suffered other health scares such as brain dysfunction and even strokes. The sleeping villagers are not good for the economy, not only are their hours of work lost, but this fear is causing many people to leave the area.

In 2015, scientists found conclusive evidence which provided a clue in this mystery. The culprit was an old disused Soviet-era uranium mine the village is built on, which was pumping out high levels of carbon monoxide, poisoning the villagers.

Hailing the breakthrough, Kazakh vice president Berdybek Saparbayev said, 'The cause of the bizarre sleeping illness has been determined. After numerous medical tests, our researchers have confirmed that carbon monoxide is to blame for the sleeping epidemic in Kalachi village.' When carbon monoxide and hydrocarbon levels rose in the disused uranium mine, oxygen levels fell in the village, he added. Tests — independently verified by experts in Prague and Moscow — showed levels of carbon monoxide in the air to be ten times the normal levels.

Now as the cause is known, Kalachi is being evacuated. The state is currently running an evacuation plan, under which people are given a place to live in a new location. Some 68 of the 223 families there have already been moved – with the rest being relocated by the end of the year.


