A country's capacity to produce wealth depends upon many factors most of which have an effect on the another. Some regions of the world are well supplied with coal and minerals, and have a fertile soil and a favorable climate; other region possess perhaps only one of these things, and some regions possess none of them. The USA is one of the wealthiest regions of the world because she has vast natural resources within her borders, her soil is fertile, and her climate is varied. The Sahara desert on the other hand, is one of the least wealthy.
