Emotion is usually considered to be a feeling about or reaction to certain important events and thoughts. An emotion can be either pleasant or unpleasant. An individual also may have a mixture of both pleasant and unpleasant emotions. People enjoy feeling such pleasant emotions as love, happiness and contentment, They often try to avoid feeling unpleasant emotions, such as loneliness, worry and get grief. However, people are sometimes not fully aware of their own emotions. Although most people believe they know an emotion is, psychologist have not agreed one definition that applies to both human being and other animals.
