- Mr. Ram an Engineer, working in Military Engineering Services was removed by an authority subordinate to that by which he was appointed. Mr. Ram challenged his removal as violation of Article 311 of the constitution.
 - Does the removal amount to violation of right under Article 311 ?
 - What are the constitutional safeguards under Article 311 ?
 - In one case, the petitioner was appointed as an honorary Paediatrician in a District Hospital through selection board. His appointment was suspended because of an interim stay granted by the Lokayukta on a complaint filed before him by one of the candidates for the post.
